Fourth sanctions package (incl. new asset freezes and travel bans for oligarchs, new restrictions on transactions with Russian state owned companies, prohibition to provide credit rating services, prohibit investments in the energy sector, ...)

 - Prohibit new investments in the Russian energy sector,
 - Introduces a comprehensive export restriction on equipment, technology and services for the energy industry in Russia, with the exception of nuclear industry and the downstream sector of energy transport,
 - Introduces further trade restrictions concerning iron and steel, as well as luxury goods.

Sanctions against Belarus, incl. SWIFT exclusions, limit financial flows, no transactions with the Belarus Central Bank, and air traffic limitations + clarification on transfer of crypto assets

 - Limits the financial inflows from Belarus to the EU (Exemption for nationals of the member countries of the European Economic Area and to nationals of Switzerland related to deposits)
 - Prohibits transactions with the Central Bank of Belarus;
 - Adds obligations on the Network Manager for air traffic management network functions of the single European sky regarding overflight prohibitions

Sanctions against Russia, incl. maritime sector + clarification on transfer of crypto assets

Exclusion of seven Russian banks from SWIFT + restriction of Russia access to Euro bank notes

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Russian propaganda media ban

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Economic sanctions on finance (incl. Alfa Bank, Bank Otkritie, Bank Rossiya, Promsvyazbank, energy, and transport sectors + restrictions on exports of dual-use goods and technology

- [Council Decision \(CFSP\) 2022/327](#) of 25 February 2022 amending Decision 2014/512/CFSP concerning restrictive measures in view of Russia's actions destabilising the situation in Ukraine
 - Imposes further restrictive measures in various sectors, particularly defence, energy, aviation and finance;
 - Imposes further restrictions on exports of dual-use goods and technology and on the provision of related services, as well as restrictions on exports of certain goods and technology which might contribute to Russia's technological enhancement of its defence and security sector. It also introduces restrictions on the provision of related services;
 - Prohibits the sale, supply, transfer or export to Russia of specific goods and technologies for use in oil refining, together with restrictions on the provision of related services;
 - Applicable until 31 July 2022
- [Council Regulation \(EU\) 2022/328](#) of 25 February 2022 amending Regulation (EU) No 833/2014 concerning restrictive measures in view of Russia's actions destabilising the situation in Ukraine
 - Gives effect to certain measures provided for in Council Decision 2014/512/CFSP2 and prohibits the sale, supply, transfer or export of dual-use goods and technology to any person, entity or body in Russia or for use in Russia, if those items are for military use or for military end-users;
 - Bans the sale of such goods and technology to specified legal persons in Russia and prohibits the provision of technical assistance and other related services as well as financing and financial assistance related to such goods and technology;
 - Requires operators to obtain a prior authorisation for the sale, supply, transfer or export of certain technologies for the oil industry in Russia and prohibits the provision of associated services necessary for deep-water oil exploration and production, arctic oil exploration and production or shale oil projects in Russia, including its Exclusive Economic Zone and Continental Shelf;
 - Prohibits the provision of technical assistance related to the goods and technology listed in the Common Military List of the European Union or related to the provision, manufacture, maintenance and use of such goods;
 - Imposes restrictions on access to the Union capital market for certain Russian financial institutions, entities as well as Russia, its Government and its Central Bank.

Suspension of visa waivers for Russian citizens

Restrictions on economic relations with the non-government controlled areas of the Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts

 - Prohibits the import into the European Union of goods originating in the non-government-controlled areas of the Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts of Ukraine, with the exception of goods having been granted a certificate of origin by the Government of Ukraine;
 - trade in goods and technology for use in certain sectors in the non-government controlled areas of the Donetsk and Luhansk Oblasts of Ukraine should be restricted. Services in the sectors of transport, telecommunications, energy or the prospecting, exploration and production of oil, gas and mineral resources, as well as services related to tourism activities in the non-government controlled areas of the Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts of Ukraine should be prohibited.
